
Our Community Commitment

Giving Back Is One of Our Highest Priorities

The goal of Amegy Bank is to contribute to local communities by targeting our charitable giving and volunteerism toward nonprofit groups that produce impactful results in the markets we serve. We remain committed to being a leader in Texas banking for our fellow Texans, and we believe that also means committing to being a leading corporate citizen.

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

In 2021, Amegy donated nearly \$1 million towards improving the quality of life of people in the communities where we do business. Although, our primary focus was on education and community services. Amegy's charitable contributions supported more than 250 nonprofits across our footprint.



EMPLOYEE VOLUNTEERISM

Our employees, many of whom are leaders in the community, find immense pride in donating their personal time to charitable projects. They volunteer thousands of hours each year to philanthropic causes.

Through Amegy Cares, our internal volunteer program, employees have the opportunity to volunteer for causes that are important to them. This program allows full-time employees eight hours and part-time employees four hours of paid volunteer time per quarter, where they can volunteer during business hours without w to use vacation time.

UNITED WAY

Amegy colleagues donated a total of \$929,000 to United Way across our Greater Houston, Dallas-Fort Worth, and Central Texas markets.

- United Way of Greater Houston: At Amegy Bank's headquarters, our Houston employees gave more than any other bank to United Way. Thanks to their United Way donors, the organization improved the lives of two million neighbors in 2021. Plus, Amegy Bank had a record-setting campaign and received the Chairman's Division Gold Level Honor Roll achievement.

- United Way for Metropolitan Dallas: Our Dallas colleagues met their fundraising goal and raised \$50,000 for United Way.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY WOMEN BUILD

Amegy's Women's Business Resource Group and Allies engaged 20 female colleagues to form a Build Team for Habitat for Humanity's 2021 International Women Build Week. This event highlights the global need for women's access to safe and affordable housing.

Amegy's Build Team raised \$5,000 and assisted in building affordable housing alongside Habitat for Humanity's construction staff.

UNITED WAY OF TARRANT COUNTY

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, more than 25% of households in Tarrant County were one crisis away from joining the 11.9% of families already living in poverty. The ongoing pandemic has only worsened this issue. Our Fort Worth colleagues donated \$5,000 to United Way to support its response to crises and serve the community's needs.
